

UPDATE REPORT

Introduction

The Parish Charitable fund was started in Spring 2022 to support those affected by humanitarian crises. This was largely in response to the Ukrainian Refugee crisis which was developing rapidly following invasion by Russian forces. Approximately 8 million individuals were displaced by the end of May.

Our Parish Priest, Fr Ruslan Kurdiumov, is from Ukraine and so has a network of contacts across the country which we have utilised in order to help those affected in Ukraine, as well as those who have needed to flee to safety

During the first 11 months of the fund we have funded a number of initiatives across Ukraine to get vital supplies and skills to where they are most needed. We also offered some support to those fleeing the country, such as an orphanage that moved to Switzerland, and some children and their mothers arriving in the UK under the government scheme.

Two priests that Fr Ruslan trained with have been using a van to distribute supplies to areas cut off by the war. Fuel prices doubled overnight due to supply issues. We made a grant to cover these costs and enable their vital work to continues. Alongside this we have sent a donated car and a 4x4 medical response vehicle to Ukraine.


FUNDS RAISED

In the event that any funds are unspent due to a decrease in need, the funds will be retained for use in the next humanitarian crisis. Supporting those in Ukraine, however, remains the priority for the foreseeable future.
